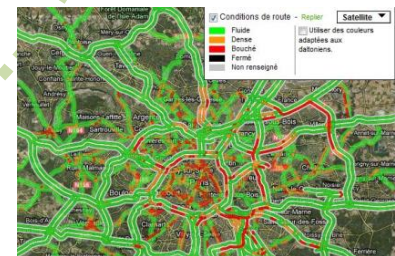

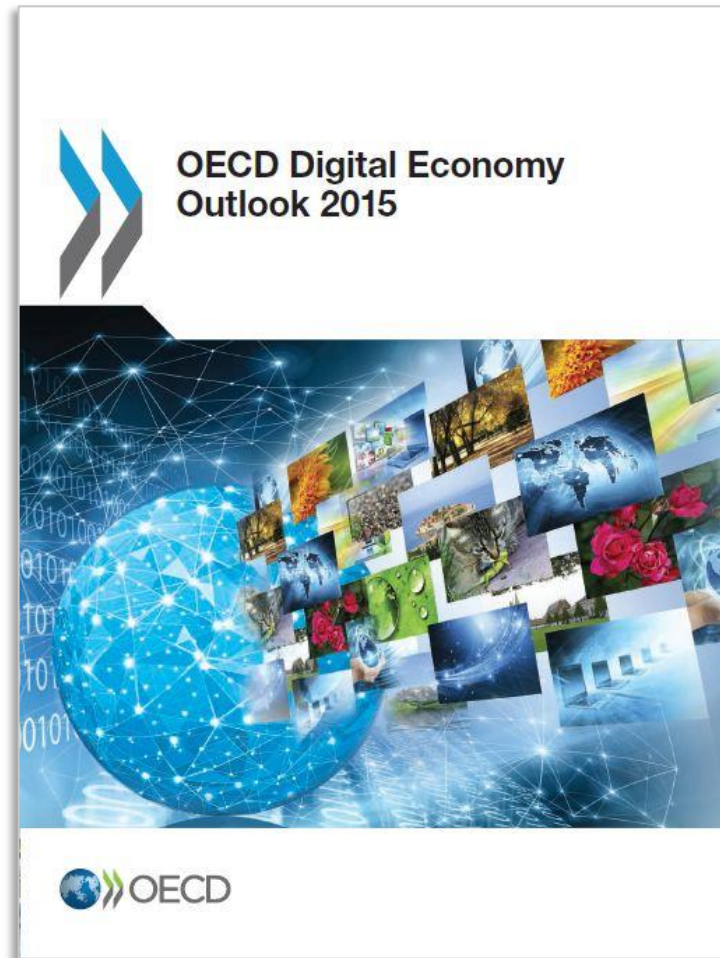

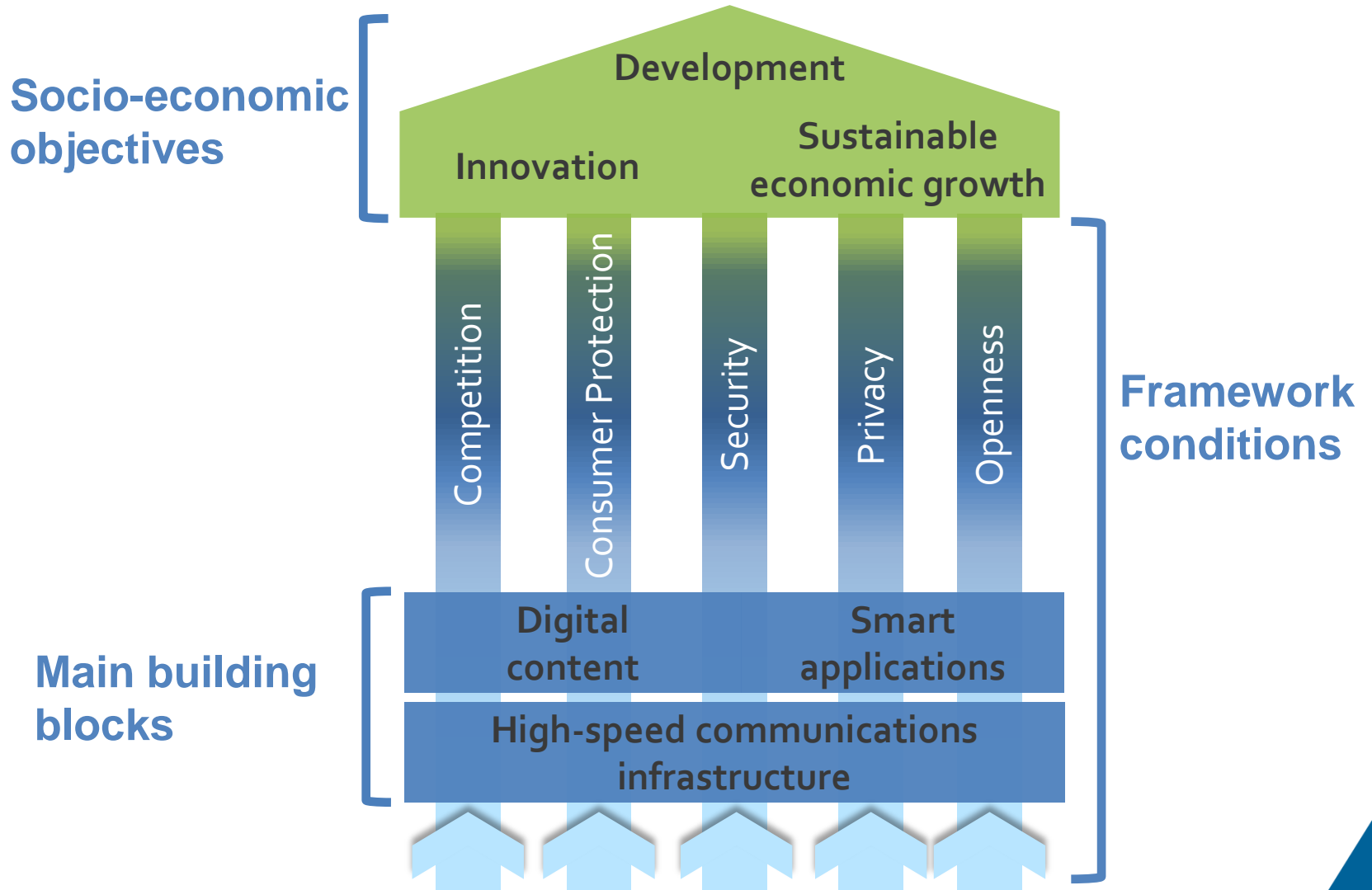
Digital Economy Outlook 2015

Sharing experience and good practices

First phase for LAC:

- Finding the right people and ensuring coordination of responses among institutions
- Questions should avoid ambiguities and address specific issues
- Complement further research and interaction

Second phase (ongoing):

- Diversity of the region; countries in very different stages of broadband policy development
- Many good practices in the region

- 10 countries in Southeast Asia:

Brunei, Cambodia, Indonesia, Laos, Malaysia, Myanmar, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand and Vietnam
