Mr. Liu Zhuoran is current Vice Chairman of ITU-R Study Group 7. He served as Drafting Group Chairman on AI 7 at the WRC-15 study cycle and Chairman of Sub-Working Group on Spectrum Monitoring in AWG.

Introduction

Mr. Zhuoran Liu has been working in spectrum management and engineering for over 14 years. At first, he was heavily involved in spectrum monitoring from 2001 to 2010 both at the national and international level. Mr. Liu was a chapter Rapporteur on monitoring of space emissions in the Handbook Rapporteur Group, and his work led to two editions of the ITU Handbook on Spectrum Monitoring. He also led the WP1C work toward ITU-R Reports SM.2181 as well as SM.2182, which are used as important supplementary information to RR Appendix 15 for reporting satellite interference. He has made substantive contributions to WP1C on major event monitoring (ITU-R Report SM.2257) and measurement techniques. In Asia-Pacific, he led the AWG SWG on monitoring and produced a number of Reports. Mr. Liu has participated in a number of times the International Space Monitoring Meetings representing the State Radio Monitoring Center of China.

Mr. Liu now works in the area of satellite coordination at the domestic and international level. He is currently responsible for the processing and examination of Chinese satellite network filings, including such science radio-communication services as EESS, MetSat, ISS and SRS. He is also responsible for coordination between or among Chinese satellite networks. He played key roles in the resolution of many difficult compatibility impasses among space science services and other services in China. He is a technical and regulatory advisor for a number of state satellite projects aiming at providing such services. He has worked for Chinese EESS satellite operators at several bilateral coordination meetings. Mr. Liu is also an active member of the Chinese Domestic Study Group on ITU-R SG 7 Affairs and a similar group on SG 4 and has made significant contributions to those groups.

Mr. Liu is currently a vice-Chairman of ITU-R Study Group 7. Being active in its activities, he is the Chairman of WG7B-2 on deep space communications issues. He

has participated at and contributed to a number of ITU and APT meetings on satellite regulations and procedures, including WP4A, the Special Committee, the CPM, the APG and WRC-12. He co-chaired a DG on AI 7 at APG15. These experiences are an important asset in carrying out his duties in the science-service related activities. He led a number of studies or projects in China, including designing of the Procedures for National Regulations for Satellite Coordination and Notification to the ITU (to be released by MIIT soon), studies on regulatory aspects on nano- and pico-satellites, annual progress reports on RRB cases and new Rules of Procedures, and inconsistencies of the Radio Regulations.

Mr. Liu has worked for the ITU as a short-term translator with the Chinese Translation Section before and during the CPM15-1, RA15 and WRC-15. He played a unique role not only as competent translator but also as a consultant in terms of technical and regulatory issues. Thanks to this background, he gained a good experience working in the Union and most importantly, working as a part of a product-line under heavy workload such as the WRC.

Mr. Liu takes an open approach in his work. He understands the importance of consultations in consensus building in ITU and APT activities and is willing to stick to it at his best ability. Mr. Liu is familiar with the mechanisms of work of the WRC and its related platforms.

Besides Chinese as his native language, Mr. Liu commands English and French at a good level, which are important assets in his international involvements.
