This meeting will establish the structure of the Preparatory Group, elect the Chairman and Vice-Chairmen, consider the nomination of other office bearers of the Preparatory Group, adopt the working methods and develop the work plan for the preparatory works of the Group for WTSA-20. The APT is planning to have four preparatory meetings for the APT-WTSA-20, one meeting in 2019, which is today's meeting and three meetings in 2020.

The work of the APT Preparatory Group is driven by the input contributions by APT Members. These contributions would enable the Preparatory Group to identify important issues and to prepare common proposals that would correctly reflect the views of the region. The preparatory meetings provide a platform for coordination among APT members to discuss and align their views and generate coordinated outputs as the Preliminary APT Common Proposals for the ITU World Assembly.

Hence, the role of the office bearers is very important to facilitate and assist the work of the Preparatory Group. Continuous and active participation of all APT members as well as the office bearers in all preparatory meetings is absolutely essential for the successful preparation works. I would like to ensure that APT Secretariat will provide support and facilitate the preparatory process for fruitful outcomes.

At previous ITU World Telecommunication Standardisation Assemblies, the APT Common Proposals that had been preliminary prepared by the APT Preparatory Groups were well received and recognized. I am confident that this Preparatory Group will also have excellent preparation and develop APT Common Proposals that will uphold the regional interest for submission to WTSA-20.

It is expected that the Ministers will adopt the Ministerial Statement which will provide high-level policy guidelines on the development of telecommunication and ICT in the Asia-Pacific region for the next five years.
